## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA

### **ARTICLE 1**

### **GENERAL EDUCATION**

#### Section 1. [121A.212] ACCESS TO MENSTRUAL PRODUCTS. 2.29

- 2.30 A school district or charter school must provide students with access to menstrual products
- 2.31 at no charge. The products must be available to all menstruating students in restrooms
- 2.32 regularly used by students in grades 4 to 12 according to a plan developed by the school
- district. For purposes of this section, "menstrual products" means pads, tampons, or other 2.33
- 2.34 similar products used in connection with the menstrual cycle.
- 2.35 EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective January 1, 2024.
